


HR GUEST SESSION BY DR. ASHA BHANDARKER, DISTINGUISHED PROFESSOR, IMI, DELHI


The guest session on HR in the FPM course "Introduction to the evolution of Management thought and foundational theories" was conducted on **Saturday**, **30th January 2021**. The eminent guest for the session was **Dr. Asha Bhandarker**, distinguished professor of OB in International Management Institute, Delhi.

The session began with discussions on the prereadings shared by Prof. Bhandarker, wherein she spoke about the concept of STROBE (Strategic organizational behavior) in the strategic human capital conversation and the 'context' as a notion in understanding the various perspectives of the outcomes of research. In her hour and a half long session, she asked the FPM scholars to look beyond narrative or explanatory research and incorporate mixed research methods а approach to enhance the predictability of their research work. She further emphasized the need for understanding the existing models and its abstractions into new research models, which may be derived from theoretical base and experiences. According to Dr. Bhandarker, starting point of any research should be the 'purpose' of the research before deciding on the causality factors and mediating/moderating factors.

The session was thoroughly engaging, wherein not only the scholars spoke about their understanding on the various questions asked by Dr. Bhandarker but also posed their specific queries pertaining to their own research work to have a better understanding. She promised the scholars that she would be available for more such insightful engagements in the future as well. Towards the end, **Dr. Pragya Gupta** thanked her for taking out time for this session and enlightening the budding research scholars towards a meaningful research journey.











ORIENTATION SESSION WITH INNOVATION AMBASSADOR


