Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida organized the Staff Development Workshop 2022 on the theme "Collaboration & Team Bonding" on **February 26, 2022.** The session was conducted under the guidance of **Dr. Dayanand Pandey** (Director, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida). The resource person of this workshop was Dr. Sudanshu Pathak, CHRO, JK Tyres. The guest was felicitated by presenting the customary green certificate at the inaugural session.

The session was steered by Dean Administration **Dr. VK Tomar**. He welcomed all the staff members and thanked them for their support and participation in the workshop. He emphasized that a new bonding will develop from the learnings of the workshop. Data literacy is the ability to read, work with, analyze and argue with data. It's a skill that empowers all levels of employees to ask the right questions of data, build knowledge, make decisions, and communicate meaning to others. He also discussed about the importance of two C's: Curiosity and Creativity to deal with data. Data is future centric and very important.

Elaborating the importance of data further, Director of the institute, Dr. Dayanand Pandey spoke about the importance of data accuracy in his inaugural address. He mentioned that the data literacy would give an edge to your professional as well as personal life. It gives boost to your confidence. He then emphasize on 10 models to inculcate in daily routine at work i.e. Freedom, Governance, Responsibility, Stakeholders Success, Positive Attitude, Loyalty with efficiency, Gratitude, Manifestation, Ethics and Happiness.
