DAY 1 INTERACTION WITH DEANS AND PROGRAMME DIRECTORS





The 10-day Induction-cum-Orientation program for the batch of 2022-24 for all three courses PGDM, PGDM (Marketing), and PGDM (Service Management) commenced on 27th July 2022 with the registration process. All of the programme directors—Dr. Pragya Gupta, PD (PGDM), Dr Shivani Bali, PD (PGDM-SM), Dr Ritika Gugnani, PD (PGDM-M)—as well as Dr Swati Agarwal, Dean of Academics, addressed the students and extended a warm welcome. They described the standards to be followed throughout their academic journey while providing a general summary of the Programme's Objectives. Students were briefed about the support system and contact points that should be reached during the academic journey. In this session, the Institute's vision and mission were articulated.

Dr Swati Agarwal, Dean (Academics) explained the institutional pedagogy and invited students to voice their expectations. She also stressed the importance of students' active involvement in all academic and non-academic activities. She briefed about the strength of the PGDM programmes, urged students to make the best use of college resources and encouraged them to suggest and participate in the academic processes.

Dr Nidhi Singh, Dean (Research) explained the importance of research to young minds. Dr Singh shared specific techniques adopted in the research process to collect, assemble and evaluate data in order to transform a student into a researcher or scholar. She described how to develop an analytical attitude while using strategies to broaden their networks and skill sets.

Dr Rahul Singh, Dean (Student Affairs), explained that the Institute aims at the overall development of its students and and encouraged them to hone their extracurricular skills along with their academics. He introduced the activities entailed under the Student Affairs Committee while giving an overview of the kind of activities that the students can look forward to. He mentioned some of the annual student activities like Gravity, and Sports Meet, as examples of student-driven activities held in the Institute.





Dr. Poonam Sharma, Dean (International Relations Committee) gave an overview of International exchange programs and other opportunities for students looking for international exposure. She outlined the importance of undergoing such programs and motivated students to undertake them as and when they are announced.

Dr. V. K. Tomar, Dean (Administration) gave his insights to students about the infrastructure, hospitality, and student-centric facilities. He also explained the formalities and rules related to hostel and mess facilities.

Students were asked to put their questions forward which were well answered by all Deans and Program Directors. this was followed by an announcement of meeting again in formal specific sessions separately.

Registration of new students continued till 05:00 pm post lunch by PMC team members. It was followed by a Rendezvous session with Director, **Prof (Dr) D N Pandey**. The Dean of Academics gave a brief introduction of the Institute's Director, Dr. D.N. Pandey followed by Director's welcome address.

MUSICAL NIGHT WITH MR. BOBBY CASH

Beginnings are always viewed as a reason to rejoice and to create a positive atmosphere in preparation for the future. **On July 27, 2022**, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida hosted a musical night to welcome the class of 2024. Nothing could have been better to ease students' concerns and show them that these two years will not only be about earning a placement offer but also an opportunity to create millions of memories at moments when they must have been apprehensive about their new trip. Music has the power to uplift one.

The Director of the Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida, **Dr D.N. Pandey**, gave a powerful speech to open the evening. He enlightened the students on practical skills that go beyond what is taught in textbooks. He talked about developing relationships that go beyond simple business dealings and establishing credibility. Dr. Pandey also stated the significance of being inquisitive and challenging the status quo. He emphasized leadership skills, which doesn't imply having followers, rather it entails being able to influence, inspire, and have an impact everywhere and anywhere. He also discussed the need for all to be responsible and accountable. A Sanskrit shloka that reads, "Knowledge is the greatest eye, Truth is the greatest triumph, Attachment is the greatest agony, and Sacrifice is the greatest happiness" served as the epilogue to his inspiring lecture.

The speech was followed by a Q&A round with the students who were curious about the placement opportunities at the campus.

Dr Rahul Singh, Dean, Student Affairs was called upon the stage to introduce the artist for the event, **Mr Bobby Cash**. He is India's first international country music artist who charted singles in Australia, and also the only Indian music artist to be featured in a documentary film by ABC television. He set the stage on fire by playing hit numbers like Falling in love with you and Train train train. It was indeed a magical night, It was observed that students started mingling with each other while enjoying the beats of the music It was their first memory in the long string of memories they will be taking with them for the rest of their lives.







DAY 2 INAUGURAL SESSION



The Chief Guest for the inaugural session was **Dr Cedwyn Fernandes**, Pro Vice-Chancellor & Director, Middlesex University, Dubai. The esteemed guest was welcomed by **Dr D. N. Pandey**, Director, Jaipuria Noida, who presented the guest with a green certificate. Dr. Pandey highlighted the importance of the induction program for the fresh batch of PGDM students. and invited Dr Fernandes to talk on the topic "Who Wants to be a Manager? An international perspective'.

Dr Fernandes began his session by highlighting the importance of a manager as a key differentiator in raising the profitability index of organizations in despairing times. He took the example of Emirates Airlines as a profitable venture even during the pandemic when most Airlines were showing a decline. Among all the important attributes, he placed utmost importance on the evolving style of managing people as it requires personal learning and change in the managers. He emphasized that becoming a manager is an ongoing journey that is specifically complex in the global context owing to multiple facets like cultural, political, economic, technology, etc. The session was attended by 350 plus students and faculty members of the Noida campus who really enjoyed the highly interactive session.

SESSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL PRESERVATION WITH PADMASHREE MRS. JAMUNA TUDU

"Bhagwaan ne mujhe bache nahi diye kyunki woh jaante the ki mere liye mere pedh hi mere bache hai." – Padmashree Mrs. Jamuna Tudu

Mrs Jamuna Tudu, a 37-year-old woman, is a climate and environmental activist residing in the village, of Markham, in Jharkhand's Purbi Singhbhum district. Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida had the privilege of hosting her as a guest speaker for the new batch of 2022-24.

Her life journey as an activist is not just inspirational but also fraught with difficulties. Jamuna Tudu since the mere age of 18, has been fighting to preserve Jharkhand's forests and prevented the destruction of fifty hectares of forest. She also rallied ten thousand women and inspired them to conserve forests and fauna. The jungle mafia, which surrounded her village with excessive deforestation, was a massive concern. Jamuna informed her village's women about the situation, and they promised to conserve the jungles that surrounded them. The women formed committees to develop and explore strategies for reducing deforestation while incorporating their traditions and beliefs into eco-friendly activities. They also picked up weapons and fought the mafia to protect the forest. The ladies supported one another and demonstrated how powerful and heroic women can be.

She also experienced the worst horror. While on their way to a neighbouring town, she and her husband, **Mr Mansingh Tudu**, were attacked with sharp stones. After receiving a blow to the head, he collapsed in a pool of blood. She figured he'd pass away. She states that following that experience, fear has no more meaning for her. Since then, Jamuna (now popularly known as Lady Tarzan) and her club of ten thousand forest protectors from three hundred towns have conducted night patrols, halted felling in over fifty hectares, and aided reforestation efforts, all while initiating rites such as tying a protective thread to trees every year on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan to always protect the trees thereby, forming a deep and personal bond with the forests.

After listening to her life story, not only the students but also the faculty members present were left dumbstruck and tearyeyed. The students also got the opportunity to ask her a few questions which she happily answered. **Dr Rahul Singh** gave a few inspiring remarks to the Padmashree recipient before the event came to an end. The positivity and concern for the environment among students were visible in their interaction with her. An enthralling session, indeed.
