THE STARTUP QUIZ

Quizzes are the best platform to increase the knowledge of any platform, so keeping that in mind, on the occasion of National Startup Day, the Centre for Entrepreneurship and Incubation (E Cell) Committee of the Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida, organized a "Startup quiz" Competition on Friday 10th February 2023. It was a successful event with active participation.

The event's CEO was **Tushar Tewari**. And the technical work was done by **Piyush Nayak**. There were a total of 7 participants and 3 rounds were conducted.

Round 1: The first round was a rapid-fire round where each participant was asked 3 questions to each participant related to startups in India. For every correct answer, 500 points were awarded.

Round 2: The second round was a Puzzle round where each participant was shown a puzzle slide and the time limit to answer the question was 1 min. For every correct answer 500 points were awarded. At the end of the round, there was a bonus question for all the participants, where all the participants were shown the same slide and the first to answer got a point.

Round 3: This round was the "guess the startup" round and this was the last round which was played on the Kahoot App. Every question has a time limit of 10 seconds.

The winner of the startup quiz was Anshuman Mohanty with a prize of Rs 2000 and 1st runner-up was Abhishek Singhal with a prize of Rs. 1000. Also, there was an audience round where the audience was given an Amazon voucher coupon for Rs 200. The winners of the audience round were Siddharth Yadav, Abhishek Tyagi, and Rajat Srivastav. CEI chairperson **Professor Joy Patra** awarded the prize to the Winners. It was a fun event with lots of learning.

THE POLLUTION CONTROL DEBATE



The Centre of Entrepreneurship and Incubation (CEI) Committee of the Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida organized a Debate on Pollution Control on 15th February 2023. The event inspired students to spread awareness of the nationally celebrated "Pollution Control Day". Students invited **Prof. Abhijeet Nair** and **Prof. Prathamesh Kittur** as their judges to evaluate the participants. A total of 8 students participated in the Pollution control debate where each student had to do a one-on-one debate. The debate was conducted in a format where, in the first round, 4 pairs of 2 candidates each (4 teams) were selected, based on a chit system, wherein they had to deliver a one-on-one debate on a topic that was given on the spot. (1 candidate in FAVOUR and the other in AGAINST the topic). In the second round, the selected candidate from each team (4 candidates in total) was now split into 2 pairs of 2 candidates each and had a one-on-one debate again for a topic that was given by the judges. And in the final round, 2 selected candidates from each pair were to give a one-on-one debate on the topic that was given on the spot by the judges. The CEO of the event was **Gopika M Nair** and all the Junior coordinators worked behind the scenes for the success of the event. The 1st position was secured by Sakshi Aggarwal a second-year student securing a voucher of Rs. 2000. 2nd position was secured by Akash Bhardwaj (first year) receiving a voucher for Rs. 1000. 6 lucky audiences (Hritik Sinha, Adeeba, Swati Gupta, Kavya Srivastav, Prakhar, Ayush Agarwal) also received Rs. 300 each worth vouchers. Some of the interesting topics that the candidates received were: "Global pollution is nothing but economic failure", "The wealthy are more accountable for environmental harm than the poor", "Increase fuel prices to encourage people to switch to more energy-efficient vehicles", "Global warming is primarily caused by overpopulation" and many more. Overall, the event was a huge success and a great source of learning for all the participants as well as the audience.
