On August 28, 2024, Hiranya, the finance club, hosted an innovative event named PictoFin, blending creativity with finance. The event kicked off at 3:00 PM and involved 19 teams, each comprising three members, entailed a unique challenge of describing words through drawings. In the first round, known as Pictionary, a team member drew a word picked randomly from a chit, using symbols and illustrations, while their teammates had 1 minute and 10 seconds to guess the word. Based on the quickest correct guesses, two teams advanced to the second round.

The second round introduced an unexpected twist: a group discussion on the topic "Budget 2024: Biggest Mistake or Masterstroke." This round, which lasted 11 minutes, required the selected teams to debate the topic, with their performance evaluated by **Prof. Aastha Gupta**, who also provided constructive feedback.

The competition concluded with Sonali Baid securing the first position and a prize of₹1500, while Vishesh Nayyar achieved second place, earning Rs 1000. On 21st August 2024, the International Relations Committee hosted the "War Chronicles" treasure hunt, where 12 teams competed using their knowledge and problem-solving skills to crack challenging clues. Industrial Visit to Maruti Rub Plast Pvt. Ltd.

An industrial visit to a manufacturing facility was organized for a group of PGDM Term IV students on 29th Aug '24. The objective of the visit was to provide industry exposure to students, which enhanced their learnings in manufacturing operations and supply chain management. The student group, accompanied by Faculty **Dr. Keshav Kr Sharma**, visited Maruti Rub Plast Pvt. Ltd.'s production facility at Surajpur, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh.

The company is a leading manufacturer of warp-knitted Geogrids and other Geosynthetic products used in the infrastructure and construction sector. Students got exposure to the factory layout, machines, and equipment, including state-of-the-art automated Technical Textile Machines. Students received a detailed briefing about the various manufacturing processes involved in the production of geogrids and other products. Through interaction with the factory general manager and other staff, students learned and developed a deeper understanding of quality management, procurement, logistics, and waste management practices used in the industry.
