Faculty Development program

Jaipuria Institute of Management Noida organized a Three-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "Advanced Panel Data Analysis using R studio and Gretl" from 25th June to 27th June 2025. The expert for the three-day workshop was Dr. Miklesh Prasad Yadav, Assistant Professor at the Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT), Kakinada. He is a prolific researcher with over 90 publications and deep expertise in econometrics. The workshop witnessed 28 participants from various reputed national institutes, including IMT Nagpur, IIT Roorkee, NIIT, Kurukshetra, Amity University, Harcourt Butler Technical University, Chitkara University, Punjab, Gurugram University, and many more.

Highlights of the FDP:

- 1. Hands-on practice using R-Studio and GRETL.
- 2. Concepts such as endogeneity, dynamic panels, seemingly unrelated regression with panel data, and issues like autocorrelation, multicollinearity, and so on were explained through real-world examples.
- 3. Focus on interactive pedagogy and experiential learning.

The program was designed with a strong emphasis on interactive and practical learning or insights for participants. Several Key topics, such as fixed and random effects models, pooled regression, Hausman tests, diagnostic checking, dynamic panel models, and model specification, were discussed with the participants. Each session was very detailed, with practical applications that allowed participants to use the techniques on industry-relevant data sets and interpret results with academic precision.

Participants appreciated the practical approach, detailed Q&A sessions, step-by-step walkthrough of various models, and discussions on academic papers and techniques used in those papers to improve their research calibre and understanding.

Orientation 2025, Day 6

As part of the Induction-Orientation-Foundation Programme for the PGDM Batch 2025–27, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida, successfully introduced a structured Book Review & Presentation session on 7th July 2025, under the visionary leadership of Dr. Subhajyoti Ray (Director) and Dr. Ritika Gugnani (Dean, Academics).

The session was conducted during the Reorientation Programmeand was in tended to give students an overviewoflast year's placement trends and future placement preparations.

The session was coordinated simultaneously across three venues. Venue 1 was handled by **Ms. Kanchan Rana and Ms. Supriya Massey; Dr. Deepak Singh and Mr. Javed** spoke at venue 2; and venue 3 was handled by **Mr. Hitesh Chadha** and **Mr. Narayan Singh Samant**. Each session discussed domain-wise placement statistics, including the highest and average packages rolled out, and the minimum eligibility requirements specified by companies.

A comprehensive training schedule was presented, including the in-house and outside interventions to be conducted during the next few months. These include aptitude preparation, resume preparation workshops, mock interview sessions, and subject-specific training sessions. The speakers stressed early preparation and participation in training activities.

Additionally, important rules, regulations, and policies related to placement procedures were given. Students were informed of the code of conduct, application limits, and mandatory participation norms.

The second session, **Understanding Job Descriptions for Informed Career Choices**, offered students a detailed breakdown of interpreting job descriptions across key domains—Marketing, HR, Finance, Operations, and Business Analytics. Conducted by respective domain heads, the session emphasized the importance of skill-building, relevant certifications, and aligning personal profiles with industry expectations. Various job roles from real companies were discussed to give students a clearer picture of what recruiters seek.

Both sessions were interactive and insightful, providing students with the tools and guidance needed to approach the placement season with confidence and purpose.

The session aimed to provide students with clarity on their upcoming placement preparation.

Certification courses were highly recommended—short-term ones like SEBI and NISM, and long-term courses like CFA and FRM (Level 1 minimum) to build domain credibility.

The Marketing session covered consumer behavior, brand positioning, and the growing influence of digital platforms. Speakers highlighted how storytelling and data-driven strategies are becoming equally important. Students were encouraged to be agile, creative, and well-versed with digital tools.

In the second half, alumni conducted a practical Group Discussion (GD) session. They offered valuable feedback on how to structure opening statements, maintain a confident yet respectful tone, and stay relevant without being repetitive. Importance was placed on clarity, logical reasoning, and composed body language during discussions.

The day proved enriching and action-oriented, giving students clarity on career expectations and enhancing their preparedness through domain exposure and alumni-led guidance. It served as a solid step towards refining both technical skills and interpersonal capabilities for future placements.


