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Health and Hygiene Drive

The **Disha CSR Committee** successfully organized a Health and Hygiene Drive on **26 February 2026** in collaboration with **Bhavishya NGO**. The initiative was conducted across three slum areas in Noida Sector 71 with the objective of promoting awareness about health, sanitation, and personal hygiene among the local community.

As part of the drive, the team distributed 130 health and hygiene kits to women and families in the community. Each kit contained essential healthcare items such as menstrual pads, antiseptic cream, pain relief gel, ORS packets, bandages, and cotton, along with hygiene products including hand wash, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and washing powder.

In addition to the distribution of kits, volunteers conducted awareness sessions on menstrual health and personal hygiene. The sessions focused on educating women and young girls about the importance of menstrual hygiene, proper usage of sanitary products, and preventive measures to avoid infections and diseases. Participants were encouraged to adopt healthier hygiene practices in their daily lives.

The drive witnessed enthusiastic participation from volunteers and community members. Including SC and JC members, a total of 15 people actively participated in the drive, contributing their time and efforts to make the initiative successful. This activity reflects the Disha CSR Committee's continuous commitment toward community welfare, health awareness, and creating a positive social impact. The initiative also helped build trust within the community, strengthening relationships and encouraging long-term engagement in similar welfare programs and future outreach activities for sustainable impact and improved public health outcomes overall in the coming years.

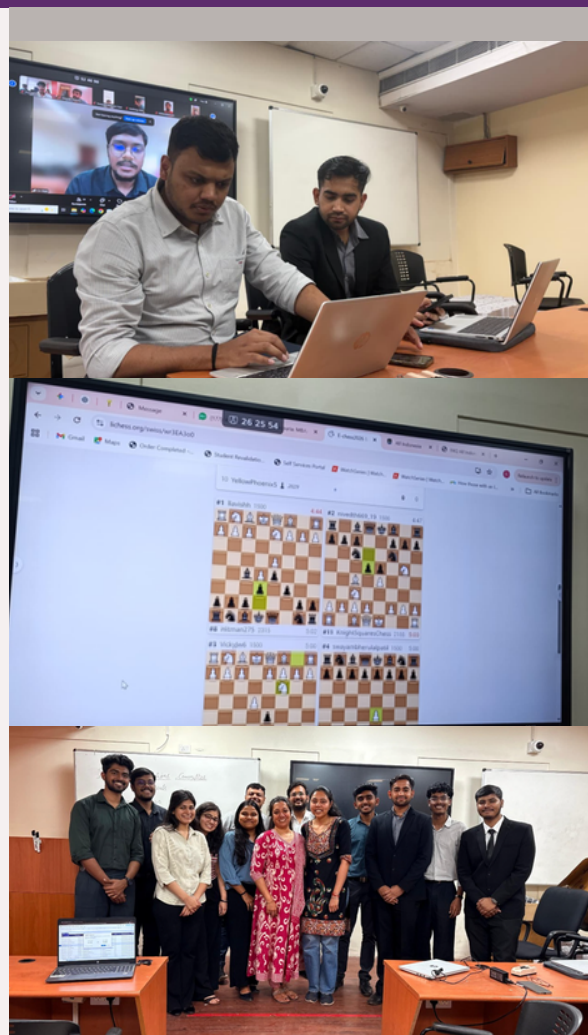


Jaipuria E-Chess Challenge

The **Jaipuria E-Chess Challenge 2026** was successfully organized on **9 March 2026** by the **International Relations Committee (IRC)** on the Lichess platform. The online tournament brought together enthusiastic chess players from different regions, including several international participants, creating a diverse and competitive environment. Participation in the tournament was free for both national and international students, with an attractive prize pool of USD 100 for the winner. The event received 30 registrations, including 7 international participants, reflecting strong interest and engagement from the global student community. We shared all rules, tournament guidelines, and participation instructions with participants in advance to ensure smooth coordination and effective event management.

The event commenced with a welcome address by IRC President Ms. Kartika Gupta, who highlighted the importance of international engagement and healthy competition through such initiatives. The tournament consisted of six rounds of rapid chess with a 5+5 time control, where players demonstrated their strategic thinking, concentration, and sportsmanship. The standard scoring system was followed, awarding 1 point for a win, 0.5 for a draw, and 0 for a loss, ensuring fair and competitive gameplay throughout the rounds.

Following the rapid rounds, the top-performing players advanced to the knockout stage, where the semi-finals and final were played in a blitz format. This added excitement and tested participants' quick decision-making skills. The event was conducted under the guidance of IRC Staff Coordinator **Dr. Sonali Mulay** and President Ms. Kartika Gupta, ensuring smooth execution and overall success.





Disha CSR LGBTQIA+ Inclusivity in Action

Disha CSR Committee organized a meaningful and awareness-driven session titled “**LGBTQIA+ Inclusivity in Action**” in collaboration with **Basera Samajik Sansthan** on **16 February 2026**. The session aimed to promote understanding, acceptance, and inclusivity toward the LGBTQIA+ community while addressing common misconceptions and societal challenges. A total of 42 students attended the session and actively participated throughout.

The session was led by **Ms. Ramkali Ji, Secretary of Basera Samajik Sansthan**, along with **Mr. Manoj Benjwal**, a dedicated LGBTQIA+ community leader and advocate who has been actively working with the community since 2008. They shared valuable insights into the struggles, rights, and lived experiences of LGBTQIA+ individuals, emphasizing the importance of dignity, equality, and social support.

The speakers highlighted the need for creating safe spaces, implementing inclusive policies, and encouraging empathetic communication within educational institutions as well as workplaces. The session proved to be highly insightful and impactful, significantly strengthening awareness about diversity and inclusion among students. It concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony, where certificates were awarded to participants of Tamasha: Nukkad Natak performed during the Annual Fest Gravity, recognizing their efforts and contributions.

Disha CSR Blanket Distribution Drive

SOX – Strategic Ops Exchange

On **10th March 2026**, the **Operations Club at Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida**, successfully hosted **SOX—Strategic Ops Exchange: Adapt. Allocate. Dominate.** under the guidance of Chairperson **Dr. Darshan Pandya**. The event brought together strategy, analytical thinking, and real-time decision-making, offering participants a dynamic platform to experience simulated operational challenges. Judged by **Dr. Keshav Sharma** and **Dr. Ankur Chauhan**, the competition gained further depth through their expert insights.

The event began with Round 1: Mystery Strategy Challenge, where teams tackled industry-based case studies spanning FMCG distribution, e-commerce logistics, pharmaceutical supply chains, and automotive manufacturing. Participants developed comprehensive strategies involving supply chain design, inventory management, transportation, and financial allocation. Midway, an unexpected disruption tested their adaptability, requiring teams to revise their approaches under pressure. This round highlighted analytical thinking, teamwork, and crisis management, with top teams advancing to the next stage.

In Round 2: Spin the Wheel, teams were given opportunities to gain strategic power-ups and additional resources, enhancing their ability to respond creatively to earlier disruptions. They refined and presented their final strategies to the judges, demonstrating their capability to balance efficiency, risk, and financial decisions within tight timelines.

After an intense competition, teams “Bar” and “Beef Sesh” emerged as winners, earning recognition and appreciation. SOX 2026 proved to be more than a competition—it was a celebration of adaptability, structured thinking, and teamwork, reinforcing the importance of strategic decision-making in complex operational environments.
